Henry VIII had 6 wives – Catherine of Aragon, Anne Boleyn, Jane Seymour, Anne of Cleves, Catherine Howard and Catherine Parr.

Henry VIII formed The Church of England, the Reformation was the transformation of England from Catholic to Protestant.

The dissolution of the monasteries was when Henry took away the land, property and money from the catholic monks and nuns.

Served mainly as a prison in Tudor times.

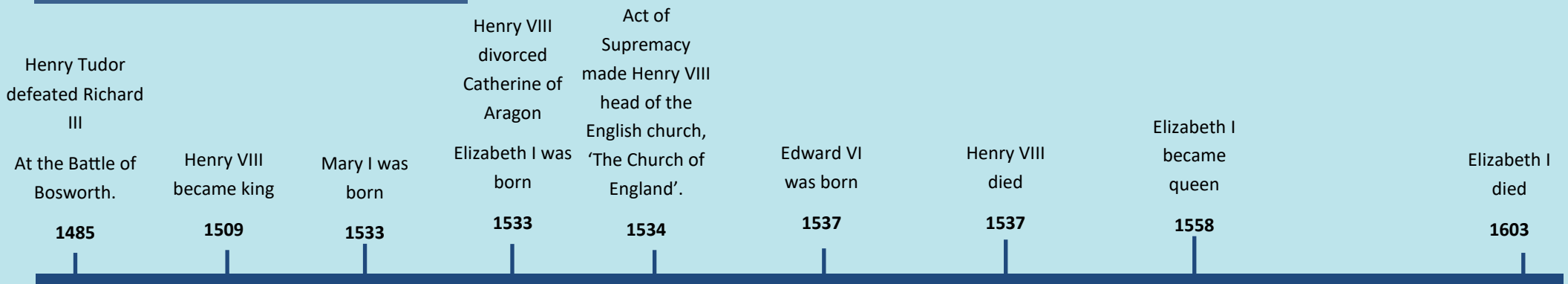
